## Sister Doloretta Miller (Lucille Miller)

Sister Doloretta Miller was born in Denton Montana on March 8, 1914. She was the daughter of John and Margaret O'Donnell Miller. A graduate of St. Mary's High School, O'Neill, Nebraska, she entered the Sisters of St. Francis on September 7, 1931 and professed her vows at Stella Niagara, New York on August 18, 1933.

Sister Doloretta graduated from St. Ambrose College, Davenport, Iowa, with a B.A. degree in 1947 and from Creighton University, Omaha, Nebraska with a MS degree in 1951. She filled many positions. She taught both elementary and secondary school for 18 years in Minot, North Dakota, Colorado and Nebraska

For the past thirteen years, Sister Doloretta was confined to a wheelchair, the result of arthritis. For almost thirteen years she taught student nurses at St. Joseph's Hospital, Minot, North Dakota, and was also the Librarian for the School of Nursing and Medical Library Her zealous efforts on behalf of the Sister's mission in Orizabita, Mexico, resulted in many donations and sponsored projects. Her last ministry was as editor for the St. Joseph's Hospital newsletter.

Sister Doloretta died at St. Joseph's Hospital, Minot on June 10, 1970. She is buried in St. Leo's Cemetery, Minot.
