Sister Leandra became certified in Spiritual Direction from the Vincentian Institute in 1998. As well as teaching at Holy Family High School, she was a counselor from 1998 through 2013. She found all the ministries fulfilling and the people she worked with a blessing.

In 2015, Sister Leandra was called and has diligently served as a member of the Provincial Council through 2022. As time permitted from 2015 to 1019, she substitute taught and volunteered at St. Frances De Sales' School and from 2017 through 2018, she was a biology tutor at Front Range Community College.

Since 2018, Sister Leandra has been proud to serve as Spiritual Assistant for the local secular fraternity of **St. Francis of the Streets**. She is also a volunteer for the Holy Family parish and her hobbies include hiking, camping, reading and playing piano.
