PAUL JEFFREY INTRODUCING EARTHBEAT'S 'LENS ON CREATION' SERIES FOR THE SEASON OF CREATION 2020 This series reminds us that the Season of Creation is a time for reflection on our personal relationship with nature. Paul Jeffrey tells a story of three orphan boys he met who were cared for in a church-night shelter in India. They smuggled him in (journalists are not allowed entry) to the large smoking dump where daily the boys salvage things such as metal scraps that have more value than even food that is still edible.

Reflection: The excess we have that may become waste that often goes to distant lands where the very poor try to live on the scraps that come from our tables and homes. "In the United States, we generate 4.4 pounds of municipal solid waste per person per day." What can I do to reduce my waste?

CHIAPAS CLINIC-IN-A-CAN

... The clinic-in-a-can containers continue to be held at the Houston Port as we await approval from Mexican authorities to allow them to be shipped by cargo to Port Progreso in Merida, Mexico. Once they arrive, they must pass through a rigorous inspection by Customs Authorities before they can then be transported by land to Palenque. We continue to work diligently to meet the constant requests for information about the containers from the Federal Commission for Protection against Sanitary Risks (COFEPRIS). It has been a grueling and frustrating experience over these past two months. Claudia Sierra, Interim Clinic Director, has met with the officials in Mexico City twice



and they still are not giving us the required permit. We have two teams of consultants in Mexico helping us fulfill the meticulous paperwork and still of no avail. Of course, the limitations due to Covid-19 are an added challenge. Offices are not open and so many permissions have been put on hold.

In other clinic news, permaculture project is almost complete (organic and medicinal farm that will contribute to the support of the Clinic). We were granted our Tax ID number and we are now working on the legal-corporate-financial relationship between the clinic and the Sisters of St. Francis. We have an HR person in place and have begun the process of marketing the job opportunities at the clinic with subsequent hiring procedures. Things continue to progress ... *Sr. Maria Elena*
