CHRISTMAS AT GRECCIO:

Please join us for an Advent anticipation of Christmas at Greccio! The year is 1223. It is Christmas Eve in Greccio. St. Francis of Assisi has obtained permission from Pope Honorius III to create a living Nativity scene for the first time. That first Nativity scene is still celebrated at the cave in Greccio to this day.



During our Advent recreation of Christmas at Greccio, we will listen to St. Francis' two biographers, Thomas of Celano and St. Bonaventure, recount and remember the events of St. Francis' first celebration of the Nativity. Our evening will begin with song. We will continue with images of Greccio while listening to Celano's and Bonaventure's historic accounts of the event, break into small groups for a short time of sharing, and then end the evening with Vespers from the Geste of the King by St. Francis.
