GOOD NEWS FROM PALENQUE:

The following message comes from Sister Maria Elena Martinez

As of 6:00 p.m. on December 29, nine of the eleven Clinic-in-a-Can containers were placed on the foundation on our property in Palenque. The drivers, security escorts, crane managers and many other participants in the project worked for 13 hours, starting at 5:00 a.m. In order for the containers to enter into our property, part of the exterior wall had to be torn down and trees had to be cut. One of the semi-trucks broke down. In spite of all the setbacks, everyone was excited, happy with progress, exhausted from the work and cheering each other on!

The neighborhood we live in is called "Nuevo Belen"... new Bethlehem. What took place today in our neighborhood with the containers was a fulfillment, a birth, giving meaning to the name. Thank you for accompanying us with your prayers, good wishes, and joy. We received messages from our sisters in the Netherlands, our Generalate in Rome, and sisters and associates across the United States. WE ARE ONE HEART.

We also want to let you know that Sr. Mica's brother, Juan, continues in critical condition in the hospital with COVID-19, on a ventilator. Mica informed us today that another brother who lives with Juan in Los Angeles, has tested positive, although his symptoms are mild. He is in quarantine. His wife is three-months pregnant. Mica has assured her family that we are with them in prayer and spirit.
