<u>Sister M. Catherine Tronolone, osf</u> of the Stella Niagara Health Center Community who died Saturday, January 9, 2021. She was born in Buffalo, NY, on August 10, 1924 and professed at Stella Niagara on August 19, 1944. Sister Catherine was a member of Holy Name Province in Stella Niagara, NY.

<u>Sister Agnes Lucille Schubert, osf</u> of the Stella Niagara Health Center Community who died Monday, January 11, 2021. She was born in Buffalo, NY, on January 2, 1923 and professed at Stella Niagara on August 18, 1942. Sister Agnes was a member of Holy Name Province in Stella Niagara, NY.

<u>Juan Mendez Vasquez</u>, (Sister Mica's brother) who died Sunday, January 3, 2021, in Los Angeles from COVID-19. The family grieves not being with him, not having his body home for burial, and not being able to say goodbye. Mica's youngest brother, Pedro, who lived with Juan in Los Angeles continues in quarantine with

COVID-19, trying to protect his wife who is three months pregnant. Mica is home with her family as they carry out the traditional nine days of prayer and mourning in their village community. Juan leaves behind a wife and children in Palenque. May he rest in peace.

UPDATE ON CLINIC IN A CAN CONTAINERS:

Palenque's Clinic Interim Director, Claudia Sierra, has been diagnosed with COVID-19. She is home with her family in Mexico City but is having growing respiratory issues due to her asthmatic condition. She has been assured of our prayers and thank you for them. She was to be in Palenque on the 19th to assist with the final work on the Clinic in a Can containers. This will not be possible.

A team of five persons from 'Clinic in a Can, Inc.' in Wichita, Kansas, will be traveling to Palenque on January 19th to put the finishing touches on the containers. This means placing solar panels on the roofs, hooking up utilities, bolting down the units, etc. This will require 10 days of work. Local laborers will be hired to assist, a crane will again be rented, etc. We will be providing for their hospitality at Casa Franciscana. There are many concerns about COVID- 19 with the travel and the poor protective conditions in Palenque. With Claudia not being able to coordinate this final phase, it is leaving our Sisters with a lot of responsibilities. Of course, they are rising to the occasion and we have no doubt all will work out. Please pray that this final phase be carried out safely and quickly, without too many difficulties and that no one gets sick.

In the spirit of our Founder, Bishop Wilhelm Emmanuel von Ketteler, who always spoke the truth to justice, the Provincial Leadership Team of Sisters of Divine Providence, along with Sisters and Associates, strongly condemn the January 6, 2021, attacks on the U.S. Capitol and the leaders of our country trapped inside. The blatant racist, white supremacist action that prompted it is even more heinous because it was spurred by those who pledged an oath to protect citizens and uphold the fundamental principles of democracy.

We would be remiss if we did not also acknowledge our own complicity in tolerating systemic racism by unquestioning participation in the trappings of white privilege, by our silence, and our lack of action, both as individuals and as members of a Catholic institution.

We pray that our Provident God will guide and strengthen both our elected leaders and all citizens in the days to come as we work to restore peace, civility, and faith in our diversity.

As a sign of our commitment to strive to make God's Providence visible by presence and advocacy, we will designate January 20, 2021, Inauguration Day, as a day of fasting and prayer. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the Chapel at Providence Heights.
