INTO YOUR HANDS AFRICA (IYHA): LOOK WHAT YOU MADE POSSIBLE: AN UPDATE ON YOUR SSUUBE FOOD PROGRAM:



Dear Sister Sarah and the Sisters of St. Francis,

Last October, you (SHP) came forward in support of feeding Life Skills students through our Ssuube Means Hope event, and for that, we thank you. Proceeds from the event were used to help fulfill a request from the headmaster at Nadagwe Secondary School to improve the learning environment so students could stay in school longer. To achieve this, our first priority was to provide the school's most disadvantaged 8th and 9th-grade students with free student lunches.

With the help of your donation, we have been able to <u>feed 205 students at Nadagwe Secondary</u> <u>School every school day since the program launched</u>; and your impact speaks for itself! Most recently, Nsamba Kassim, the school's headmaster, reported that the number of absent students on any given day has dropped from 10 to 1.5! As a result, test scores have increased, and students are spending more time at school rather than leaving to find food.

A mother of one of our senior two students says, "In our homes, we hardly have enough food to feed the entire family, and quite often, we only have one proper meal a day. IYHA giving our kids lunch is a blessing we thank God for daily."

A student notes, "Through accessing lunch at school, I now spend an additional hour each day after class revising my notes and reviewing what has been taught to me (rather than leaving to find food). This has helped me to improve my academic performance."

One of our female students says, "Now I come to school ready to study as I am assured of a delicious lunch! I take this opportunity to thank the donors of IYHA for making this happen. I now see my future as bright because I am assured of completing my studies."

Food insecurity is a significant problem in our Ugandan communities. Most kids attending Nadagwe have five to six siblings, which means meals at home may be scarce. Providing these students with lunch increases their focus, lifts their spirits, and motivates them to work harder. These are the people your donation directly impacts, and any way that we can ensure these children are fed is a way we can ensure they have an opportunity to succeed. Last year's event was a huge help in doing that, and there is something profoundly beautiful about seeing kids who would otherwise go without lining up for free, nutritious food.

We thank you again for choosing to be a part of their story and ours.
